STEPS IN ESTABLISHING A NEW CHAPTER OF SIGMA GAMMA EPSILON

National Honorary for the Earth Sciences

STEP 1 – PETITION. Students within a recognized four-year college or university may petition to establish a new chapter within their geoscience department. A minimum of five qualified students is needed to establish a chapter. In addition, a faculty member of the department must be willing to serve as chapter advisor. Any registered student, majoring in a branch of the Earth Sciences, who has completed at least 10 semester hours or 15 quarter hours of Earth Science courses, with a minimum average GPA of 3.00 for all Earth Science courses, and a minimum 2.67 overall GPA, is qualified for membership.

The petition should include the following:

- 1. Letter of intent (cover letter), signed by all the petitioning students, that includes the name and location of the college or university.
- 2. Letters of support from the department chairman and potential chapter advisor. Letters from other faculty members and/or administrators (e.g., dean of the college) also may be included. The point is to demonstrate that there will be a *long-term* commitment by the department to sustaining an active chapter.
- 3. Brief personal record for each petitioner (name, address, e-mail address, class year, geoscience credits, geoscience GPA, overall GPA, summary of science-related interests and activities).
- 4. Information about your college or university (history and accreditation) and your geoscience department (faculty, program[s] of study, and courses). This may be photocopies of the pertinent pages from your college catalog.

STEP 2 – CAMPUS VISIT. After receiving your petition, the regional Vice President for your province, or another national officer, will contact the students and/or faculty advisor to arrange a short visit to your department. Typically, the visit includes a meeting with the petitioning students, a meeting with the department chair and faculty advisor, and a tour of the department and its facilities. After the campus visit, the national officer will submit a report to the National Office.

STEP 3 – THE VOTE. The report on the site visit is distributed to all members of the National Council. A majority vote of the National Council is required to grant a charter for a new chapter. This step is largely a formality.

STEP 4 – THE INSTALLATION. Following a positive vote, the National Office will notify your department to proceed with their first initiation ceremony. The date of this ceremony becomes the date of charter for a new chapter.

Ideally, this four-step process can be completed within one academic year. However, the exact timeline depends on faculty and student schedules within the petitioning department and the availability of the National Officers.
